

Lung Cancer Screening for Comprehensive Cancer Control Coalitions:

Comprehensive Cancer Control (CCC) is a collaborative process through which a community pools resources to reduce the burden of cancer; resulting in reduced cancer risk, earlier detection of cancer, better treatment and improved quality of life.

The CCC National Partnership ("National Partnership") consists of 17 leading national cancer organizations that come together to utilize their combined strengths and resources to support and advance the work of CCC coalitions. Two strategic goals guide the work of the National Partnership: to coordinate national CCC efforts and to facilitate and provide support to CCC coalitions. Cancer Screening Work Group

One priority area for the National Partnership is providing technical assistance and capacity-building for coalitions to increase lung and colorectal cancer screening rates. Through webinars and developing resources, the screening work group hopes to increase awareness among cancer coalitions about screening recommendations and promising interventions to increase access to and uptake of screening.

Early detection of lung cancer saves lives. Low-dose CT is a safe and painless screening recommended for individuals who meet eligibility criteria for being at high-risk of developing lung cancer. The cancer screening work group within the National Partnership has compiled the following resources to help cancer coalitions in promoting and supporting members with lung cancer screening efforts.
